Subject:- MINUTES OF THE 60<sup>TH</sup> MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES HOUSING FOUNDATION HELD ON 30.11.1999.

A meeting of the Executive Committee of the Federal Government Employees Housing Foundation was held on 30.11.1999 in the Committee Room of Works Division, B-Block, Pak. Secretariat under the chairmanship of Secretary, Housing & Works. The list of participants is annexed.

2. The agenda consisted of the order passed by the Rawalpindi Bench of the Lahore High Court on 8.11.1999 containing nine directions to the Foundation for allotment of plots to the categories of persons mentioned in the said order. These, inter-alia contained the directions to open up the date of acceptance of applications for thirty days from the date of the said order for all those categories and issue allotment letters to the members of the superior judiciary within one month from the date of the order.
3. The committee examined all the directions contained in the order and considered the factual and legal implications for determining the lines of actions for implementation thereof. The Legal Adviser of the Foundation was also invited to participate in the discussions and assist the Executive Committee.

4. In view of the factual position regarding plot allotment letters issued and remaining available plots, the implications and sensitivities of some of the directions the committee decided to request the Legal Adviser, Mr. Mansoor Ahmad for the following:-

- i) To bring to the notice of the Honourable Court the factual position of allotment and availability of plots and the possible public reactions about some of the directions and their sensitivities, if possible.
- ii) To inform the Honourable Court about the practical difficulties for the Foundation to adhere to the time limit of one month for issuance of allotment letters to the members of the superior judiciary; and
- iii) the importance of the eligibility criteria at par for all categories of applicants;
- iv) Any other suitable action for amicable solution/understanding about the issue.

5. The Legal Adviser Mr. Mansoor Ahmad agreed to take up the matter with the Honourable Court accordingly and informally to report the matter back to the Foundation at the earliest.

6. *The Legal Adviser informed the Executive Committee that legal grounds were available for filing an appeal. The Committee, therefore, decided that an intra court appeal may be filed and if necessary an appeal in the Supreme Court may also be filed subsequently.*
